TARDY PROCEDURES

TEACHERS WILL MARK STUDENTS “TARDY UNEXCUSED” WHEN A STUDENT IS NOT IN HIS/HER ASSIGNED SEAT OR STATION WHEN THE TARDY BELL RINGS.

- 1st TARDY - WARNING LETTER
- 2nd TARDY - WARNING LETTER & PARENT CONTACT
- 3rd TARDY - WARNING LETTER & PARENT CONTACT
- 4th TARDY - LUNCH DETENTION – 2 DAYS & PARENT CONTACT
- 5th TARDY - ISS (FULL DAY) & PARENT CONTACT
- 6th TARDY - AFTER-SCHOOL or SATURDAY WORK DETAIL & PARENT CONTACT
*Transportation is the responsibility of the parent/student

*FAILURE TO SERVE TARDY CONSEQUENCES WILL RESULT IN ADDITIONAL DISCIPLINARY CONSEQUENCE FOR NON-COMPLIANCE WITH ASSIGNED DISCIPLINE.

TARDIES ARE CUMULATIVE EACH GRADING PERIOD.
TARDIES RE-SET EACH GRADING PERIOD.

EXCESSIVE TARDIES TO FIRST PERIOD WILL RESULT IN LOSS OF PARKING PRIVILEGES.

DRESS CODE PROCEDURES

The dress and grooming of students shall be that which contributes to the health and safety of the individual and which is non-disruptive of the educational activities and processes of the school.

1. Shoes shall be worn. Skate tennis shoes and bedroom slippers are unacceptable and not allowed.
2. Clothing that exposes the entire shoulder, tube tops, spaghetti straps, or similar types of clothing may only be worn with a blouse or shirt. (There is no 2 finger rule.) Clothing exposing the torso or the midriff, either front, back, or sides shall not be worn. Underwear shall not be visible. Clothing shall not expose the mid-chest area. Clothing not properly fastened or with tears that are indecent shall not be worn. Clothing traditionally designed as undergarments or sleepwear shall not be worn as outer garments. All pants and shorts shall be secured at the waist. Boys' shirts shall have sleeves. Mini-skirts, mini dresses, and short shorts shall not be permitted. Hemlines shall be no shorter than fingertip length.
3. Hair shall be clean and neatly groomed. Head coverings shall not be worn unless required for religious observance or health-related reasons.
4. Garments and/or jewelry that display sexual, vulgar, drug, gang, weapons, or alcohol-related wording or graphics, or that provoke or may tend to provoke violence or disruption in the school, shall not be worn. Wallet chains shall not be worn.

CONSEQUENCES
(cumulative for the entire school year)

- 1st VIOLATION** - Conference, change clothes, parent phone call
2nd VIOLATION - Conference, change clothes, parent phone call, 1 day lunch detention
3rd VIOLATION - Conference, change clothes, parent phone call, 1 day ISS
4th VIOLATION - Willful disobedience, Subject to OSS

If a student is not able to change his/her clothes during any of the above violations, that student will be sent to ISS for the remainder of the day.

STEINBRENNER HIGH SCHOOL **CELL PHONE AND ELECTRONICS POLICIES**

During school hours (8:30am -3:25pm), cell phones and other electronic devices are not to be activated or used in any manner and must be stored out of sight (unless authorized for school use). **Any visible cell phones or electronic devices are subject to confiscation.** Students may use cell phones during their lunch period in the cafeteria and/or on the cafeteria patio area. Students may not take pictures, record video or audio of any kind. **Electronics may not be used during the change of class periods.**

CONSEQUENCES (cumulative for the entire school year)

- 1st Offense - Confiscation, Warning, Parent Notification, phone returned to student **at the end of the student's day**
- 2nd Offense - Confiscation & Parent Notification
- 3rd Offense - Confiscation, Parent Conference, & Lunch Detention
- 4th Offense - Confiscation & ISS
- 5th Offense - Willful disobedience, subject to OSS

Confiscated cell phones and electronics are secured in the Student Affairs Office. **On the second (and/or subsequent) electronics violation(s), a parent or guardian must come to the school to retrieve the phone or electronic device once it has been turned in by the confiscating teacher. Classroom instruction will not be interrupted for the retrieval of cell phones/electronics.**

Students who refuse to relinquish a cell phone or electronic device and all components will receive disciplinary consequence for willful disobedience.
